NCRF Spring Quarterly Meeting Recap

The July meeting opened with Matt Johnson (President) making a few announcements. He indicated the strong financial position of the association, and the upcoming training. He also announced that October's *Member Appreciation* meeting would be held at the Silver Cloud near the stadium and that parking vouchers would be available.

Programs Director, Pam O'Connor, introduced the speaker for the meeting – Dr. Lizbeth Claus, who is published widely in global human resources and is an expert on duty of care. Her presentation reviewed the contribution of HR analytics to global talent management and illustrates some applications that global HR practitioners can employ in various functional areas of HR to use data strategically for decision-making.

Dr. Claus's first opening slide asked the question: "Do you really know your employees as well as they are known as consumers?" The presentation unfolded with an explanation of HR analytics and why we should care. Analytics is more than the tools we normally hear with regard to this subject: HR metrics, benchmarking or balanced scorecards. Using data to predict certain behaviors, HR analytics integrates human resource practices. Essentially it equates with strategy and adds value to the organization. HR analytics is a movement of data to make decisions – it starts with organizing the data, analyzing and interpreting, then translating to knowledge by which to make decisions.

And where would our own companies fit on the HR analytics continuum? In the range from novice to extremely data-driven. For example Dr. Claus indicated that IT companies tend to be more data driven and those having HR functional expertise in dealing with the data can be more of a strategic business partner. There are various uses for the data. There are also challenges in HR analytics, such as the cost of HR data investment, the perception of being big brother, global data integrity and employee data protection to name a few. The dark side to the analytics could be disparate impact in what is found in the specific details and decisions based on the analytics, HR confidentiality and employee privacy. Having the HR analytics skills means that one can complement their team, gain employee trust through data governance and even balance HR instinct and emotions with evidence when making decisions. The roadmap to HR analytics would mean scoping the project, assembling the team, managing the data and taking strategic action. The last slide of the presentation by Dr. Claus was a quote from Alvin Toffler, Future Shock, 1970: "The illiterate of the future will not be the person who cannot read. It will be the person who does not know how to learn."

The meeting came to an end. It helped the participants learn how to effectively use HR analytics to help drive decisions.
